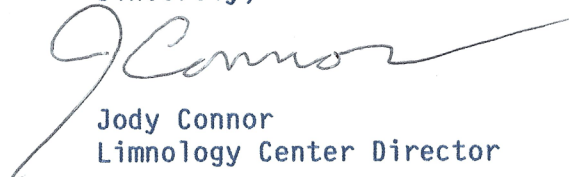

There are many pros and cons to controlling aquatic weeds. Probably the most important question is, when is an aquatic weed a nuisance or what weeds are beneficial to the lake and which are not. If weeds appear to be a nuisance in front of ones cottage, raking is the most cost-effective means of creating a family swimming area. Other techniques are more costly and may need permitting.
